Abstract:

The purpose of this study is to assess the integration of and attitudes toward an osteopathic curriculum in the setting of a community-based Family Medicine residency. This includes the process of developing didactics, workshops, and a clinic dedicated to Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine (OMT). The aim of this study is to gauge the consensus of the residents and faculty regarding their attitude towards OMT and to demonstrate the importance of application of OMT in a clinical setting.
